# **UTILITY BILLING UPDATES**

### Water & Sewer Rates Increase

The Milaca City Council passed an increase to water rates. The base increased \$4.03 and the rate increased \$1.63 per 1,000 gallons of water. The sewer base rate will increase \$3.09; actual usage will increase to \$3.79. These increases will take effect on the February statements.

# Mini Truck / UTV / Golf Cart Permits

To operate a mini truck, UTV, or Golf Cart within city limits, you will need a Police Department issued permit. These permits are good for three years, and have a fee of \$50. Permits are purchased at the Milaca Police Department, located inside City Hall; the application can be downloaded at <a href="https://www.cityofmilaca.org/police-department">https://www.cityofmilaca.org/police-department</a>. # Winter Parking

Please remember that winter parking rules are in effect until April 1<sup>st</sup>, regardless of the snow cover. These rules prohibit on-street parking on any city street November through April 1<sup>st</sup> from 1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. and/or during a snow event. A snow event occurs when snowfall is two inches or more and ends when the roads have been cleared to full width.

# WINTER PARKING AND SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS

- Do NOT blow, shovel or push snow from your driveway into the street. It is illegal and the City will be issuing code enforcement violations on residents who violate this law (Minnesota Statute 160.2715).
- When shoveling your driveway apron, shovel the snow to the right of your driveway. If you are looking at the street, it will reduce the amount of snow in your driveway when the plow comes by.
- Do NOT park your vehicle in the street. (No parking is allowed on any city street November through April 1<sup>st</sup> from 1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. and/or during a snow event. A snow event occurs when snowfall is two inches or more and ends when the roads have been cleared to full width.)
- Please help keep fire hydrants clear next to your home.
- Do not place your garbage cans in the street. Ensure they have a spot at the edge of your driveway.
- Keep the area around and behind your mailbox clear of snow. It allows room for more snow without it piling up.

### PARKS

- Cross country ski, fat bike, and snowshoe trails will be groomed as soon as snow conditions allow thanks to volunteers. Keep an eye on the Milaca Trails Initiative Facebook page for trail conditions.
- The freeskate and hockey rink are open. The parks crew will continue making ice as weather conditions improve. The warming house schedule will be posted weekly on the City of Milaca Facebook (<u>facebook.com/cityofmilacamn</u>) and on the website (<u>cityofmilaca.org/ice-rink</u>). The warming house is closed if the temperature is below 0 degrees.

The Deputy Registrar is open to the public Monday through Thursday 7:30 am – 4:30 pm, and 7:30 am - 12:00 pm on Fridays. If you have a transaction that is going to take longer, please try to be here at least 15 minutes before we close. Initial or change of address for Real or Enhanced Driver's licenses will not be processed after 3:30 pm Monday – Thursday and after 11:00 am on Fridays. The knowledge test is offered here on a computer in the office. It can get a bit noisy here, so if you need to bring ear plugs, they are allowed. The test is by appointment only and the fee is \$10. Knowledge test appointments can be made on our website cityofmilaca.org/registrar. We try very hard to help everyone, so please be patient with us!

New changes to DNR are coming hopefully in March!! We may be able to start doing fishing and hunting licenses, so that will be a new change, as well as a brand new DNR system! We will put notices up once those changes happen to inform everyone.

State offers road test appointments on Thursdays. Appointments can only be made online at <u>drive.mn.gov</u> or if you need assistance, you can call the state at (651) 284-1234. Be aware that appointments are limited, so it may say no availability. We have been told that midnight is the best time to try. Any questions about the road tests need to be answered by state, as we have nothing to do with them.

If you need a question answered right away, please email us at <u>depreg@milacacity.com</u> and we can answer your questions. If you need anything looked up that is not public information, you do have to come into the office due to data privacy. We also welcome everyone to utilize the drop box for tab renewals, DNR transactions, and even title transfers if completed! We check the box every day and do the work in between customers. Please fill out the provided form to go with the paperwork dropped off.

We appreciate all of our customers, so thank you for trusting us to serve you! Stay safe on those snowy roads!

Americans to search for alternative methods of home heating. Wood burning stoves are growing in popularity and space heaters are selling rapidly, or coming out of storage. Fireplaces are burning wood and man-made logs. All these methods of heating may be acceptable but without caution, they're a major contributing factor in residential fires.

#### Cooking

Families and guests tend to gather in the kitchen, but it can be the most hazardous room in the house if you don't practice safe cooking behavior. Careless use of cooking equipment, usually a range or stovetop, is the leading cause of home fires and home-fire injuries in the United States. ALWAYS have someone watching the stove!

#### **Carbon Monoxide Alarms**

Carbon Monoxide (CO) poisoning can happen at any time of the year, but the danger is greater during the winter when doors and windows stay closed and fireplaces, gas heaters, or other fuel burning appliances are in use. In addition, people can also be exposed to deadly CO levels when "warming up" their cars in garages or keeping them running when stuck in snow.

Keep your alarms ready!

• Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed within 10 feet of each sleeping room or inside each sleeping room.

• Test CO alarms monthly.

• If a CO alarm sounds and you feel ill, call 911 immediately. If you feel fine, open windows and doors and call your utility company.

• Clear snow and debris from furnace, dryer, fireplace or oven vents around your home to prevent a CO buildup.

Radon is a colorless and odorless gas that comes from the soil. The gas can accumulate in the home. Radon gas decays into fine particles that are radioactive. When inhaled, these fine particles can damage the lungs. Exposure to radon over a long period of time can lead to lung cancer.

It is estimated that 21,000 people die each year in the United States from lung cancer due to radon exposure. A radon test is the only way to know how much radon is in your home. Radon can be reduced with a mitigation system.

#### Mold

Several factors lead to increased concerns about mold during the winter months. Moisture conditions indoors can lead to the growth of molds and mildews. While forced air heating systems make indoor air drier overall during the winter months, certain areas of the home may experience intensified levels of humidity because of a lack of ventilation.
